## OSU Homecoming Beginnings

**October marks the 91st Homecoming celebration at OSU. Read below how the tradition got started and how you can take part in the celebration.**

What began as a small town harvest carnival at the beginning of the twentieth century has evolved into what is now “America’s Greatest Homecoming Celebration.” Along the way, with the support of the OSU Alumni Association and the efforts of the student body, OSU’s Homecoming has grown into a week-long spectacular that draws tens of thousands of alumni, family and friends back home to Stillwater each fall.

The very first Homecoming was held as part of the Harvest Carnival in the fall of 1913, but it wasn’t until seven years later that the OSU Alumni Association hosted its first official Homecoming celebration. On October 30, 1920, 90 Oklahoma A&M alums returned to Stillwater for festivities including the Cowboy’s loss at the hands of Texas A&M, a dance and a dinner hosted by Alumni Association President Monroe Otey.

Following the war in 1946, there was a record attendance of 20,000 alumni and the largest parade was held including more than 50 floats, six bands and other community entries. Since that time, the event has grown and today is recognized as “America’s Greatest Homecoming Celebration,” drawing more than 70,000 alumni back to campus each year.

In 2010, the OSU Alumni Association began fundraising for the \$8 million Homecoming and Student Programs Endowment as part of the \$1 billion Branding Success campaign. OSU is one of the only schools left in the nation with an event like Walkaround, and once fully funded, the endowment will ensure future generations of Cowboys will be able to experience “America’s Greatest Homecoming Celebration” as we know it today.

OSU’s Homecoming is presented by the OSU Alumni Association and is planned by the student-driven Homecoming Executive and Steering committees. OSU’s Homecoming is a longstanding, exciting and colorful tradition for both campus and community.

We encourage you to join current students, alumni, and the Stillwater community as we celebrate the 91st edition of “America’s Greatest Homecoming Celebration”: ‘Where Your Story Began’. (Apt. 74-8).

· We will replace any of your burned out light bulbs with energy efficient designs upon request.

· Maintenance workers always carry identification and should leave a card in your apartment for work done while you were out. If you have any questions about the identity of workers or work being done, please call the ResLife Facilities Management Office (FMO) at 405-744-8510 for confirmation.

· To request maintenance in your apartment, please call the FMO at 405-744-8510. The FMO is open from 8am – 8pm Monday thru Friday.

· If you have an emergency maintenance issue after regular office hours or on weekends, please call 405-744-8510; a recording will guide you through reporting report your maintenance issue.

### ***Cable TV Issues***


· To report problems with your cable TV, please call 405-744-9159; be sure to let the person who answers your call know the neighborhood in which you live.

# Be Visible, Use Sidewalks and Be Safe

Sidewalks are an important piece of a walking route to school. Paved sidewalks are “pedestrian lanes” that provide people with space to travel within the public right-of-way separated from motor vehicles and on-road bicycles. Sidewalks provide places for children and adults to walk, run, skate and play, and are often used by young bicyclists. Continuous and accessible sidewalk networks improve mobility for all pedestrians and are particularly important for pedestrians with disabilities. They provide access for all types of pedestrian travel to schools as well as work, parks, shopping areas, transit stops and other destinations.

- Ensure your safety and always use sidewalks rather than the road.
- Use the crosswalks for crossing the streets
- Use the rule of road-sharing and safety, such as looking both ways before crossing and don't always assume the motorist sees you.
- Do not wear dark clothing when walking or riding your bike at night.

## FGSH Policies and Procedures

### Key and Lockout Reminder

Keys are issued for the use of the resident(s) only. Lending keys to a person not listed on the housing contract is not permitted. All keys are the property of the University and may not be duplicated. If a resident is locked out of his/her apartment, the resident must go to the Family Resource Center (FRC) and check out a key (identification is required). Unregistered guests will not be assisted into the apartment in the event of a lock out. Excessive lockouts could lead to disciplinary action. Lockouts will be charged to the Primary's bursar account according to the following rate structure:

1st and 2nd Lockouts: Free

3rd and 4th Lockouts: \$10

5th Lockout and on: \$20

If a resident loses an apartment key or mailbox key, the lock(s) to the apartment/mailbox must be changed. The cost of the lock change will be charged to the Primary's bursar account. At the end of the housing contract, all keys must be turned into the FRC. If all keys are not turned in, charges for a lock change will be assessed. If all extra keys are turned in along with all original official keys, a credit will be issued.



## Help OSU Conserve Energy

Before leaving for Fall Break remember these important steps for energy savings:

- Turn off all possible electronic equipment, including: computers, monitors, speakers, printers, etc.
- Unplug items such as fans, chargers, radios, and appliances, such as coffeemakers.
- Close blinds and tilt the slats upward to keep the sun from heating up spaces unnecessarily.
- As always, turn off the lights as you leave.

## Keep Safe: Fire Facts

- 3,800 university housing fires occur each year in the US.
- 88 percent of university housing fires are cooking fires. (Apt. 12-4)
- Small, confined cooking fires account for 81 percent of university housing fires.
- University housing fires occur most frequently during the late summer and fall; Fires in September, October and November account for 33 percent of all fires throughout the year.
- 12 percent of non-confined university housing fires are unintentional or careless actions.

## The BUS--Campus and Community Transit

The BUS is the campus and community transit service operated by the Department of Parking and Transit Services at OSU. The BUS provides fixed-route transit services throughout Stillwater and the OSU campus. Two routes provide service on the main campus every 7 minutes from 6 am to 7pm and every 15 minutes after 7pm. The BUS also provides public transportation in Stillwater to all citizens from 6:30am to 7pm Monday through Friday. The BUS fares are as follows:

OSU Students, Faculty, and Staff .....Free with ID  
 General Public ..... 50 cents (\$0.50)  
 Child Under 5..... Free when accompanied by paying passenger  
 Child/Young Adult age 5-18; Seniors age 60+ ..... 25 cents (\$0.25)  
 Persons with ADA Disability Card & Persons with Medicare Card ..... 25 cents (\$0.25)  
 Exact fare required; fares are for one-way trips. Return trips require additional payment.
